

Four Points Re Nicaea



Augustine's Caution:

"The formula three persons has been coined, not in order to give a complete explanation, but in order that we might not be obliged to remain silent"!

Four Points Re Nicea

1. In the "economy" of salvation, God has revealed God's self as Father, Son, & Spirit.

Deut. 6:4-5 Hear, O Israel: The LORD is our God, the LORD alone. You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might.

John 1:1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

Acts 1:8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

Nicaea: Full Divinity of the Three

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty...

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten not made. Of one Being with the Father...

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified...

Four Points Re Nicea

- 2. The economic Trinity corresponds to God's inner being, i.e., the "immanent" Trinity.
- God reveals God's self as God really is.

 The Son (and Spirit) are equally divine and eternal with the Father.

Two Rejected Views



Modalism: Father, Son, and Spirit are in fact simply three different ways God has revealed God's self.

Adoptionism: the Son is a perfect human being, adopted by God to be Savior of the world

Arius (256-336): "There was a time when He was not."





"The defeat of the doctrine of the Trinity"

[Gradually after Nicaea] "the doctrine of the Trinity was identified as the science of God's inner relatedness. The result was a one-sided theology of God that had little to do with the economy of Christ and the Spirit."

Four Points Re Nicea

3. God is to be understood as three persons in one undivided substance.


hypostasis → 3

(God is personal, but God is not 3 persons as independent, individual beings!)

The Principle of Complementarity




Niels Bohr: Wave and particle models are logically incompatible, but...both are necessary!
