Parody Of the Prophets' Call

Isaiah 6:5

And I said, "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, yet my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!"

Jeremiah 1:6

Then I said, "Ah, Lord God! Truly I do not know how to speak, for I am only a boy."

Jonah 1:3

But Jonah set out to flee to Tarshish from the presence of the Lord. He went down to Joppa and found a ship going to Tarshish; so he paid his fare and went on board, to go with them to Tarshish, away from the presence of the Lord.

Parody Of the Prophecy itself

Hosea 4:1-2

Hear the word of the Lord, O people of Israel,

for the Lord has an indictment against the inhabitants of the land.

There is no faithfulness or loyalty and no knowledge of God in the land.

Swearing, lying, and murder, and stealing and adultery break out; bloodshed follows bloodshed.

Amos 1:9-10

Parody Of the Prophets' dispair

Jeremiah 20:7,14 & 18

Why did I come forth from the womb to see toil and sorrow and spend my days in shame?
