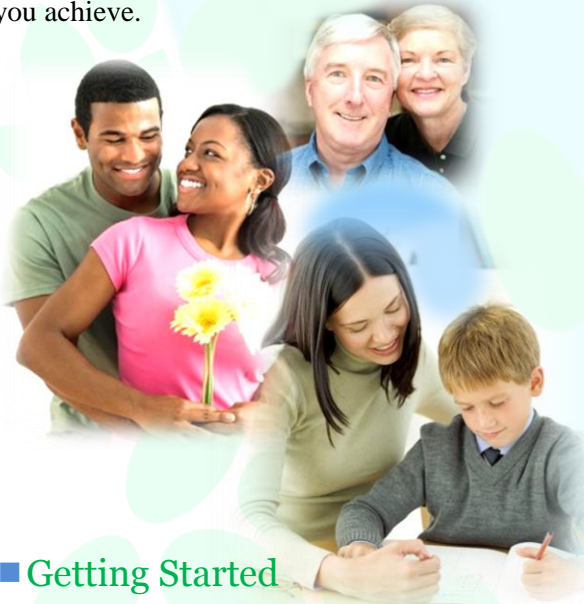


■ Hope and Healing for Your Life

Lynda Bradley, MA, LPC, NCC



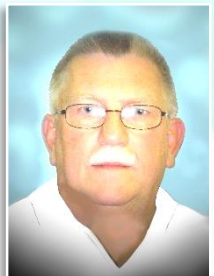
